

Dear Parents and Students of the Europagymnasium Auhof,

As the students of the lower classes have also been in lockdown since Tuesday, I mainly turn to the legal guardians of this group to explain the organization of distance learning, but also the day care classes and the learning stations at our school.

Distance learning:

In the lower grades we mainly use the Eduvidual learning platform, which is supplemented by Jitsi, BigBlueButton and MS Teams as video platforms. You will find detailed instructions for Eduvidual (from login to an overview of the tasks or video conferences) on our homepage under E-Learning / Tutorial Eduvidual in German and English. You can also find the quicklinks on this page, which enables a quick introduction to the class courses. Basically, there are weekly work assignments and video conferences that are based on the timetable. Once a week there should be a short video conference or chat with the teacher to avoid the students from becoming underwhelmed or over challenged.

Supervision/day care classes:

We have around 30 students in the day care classes every day. The students get a laptop and usually do the work in Eduvidual. Generally, supervision takes place on the 1st floor. You can register by email at betreuung@europagym.at. The students usually attend all six units and the TABE (afternoon supervision) is also possible. However, there is no lunch. Anyone who wants to leave early needs a written excuse from their parents.

Learning stations:

Starting next week there will also be study stations with two hours in German, English and Mathematics every day. The students, especially those who underachieve in individual subjects, have the opportunity to receive extra help from a subject teacher. If you have the impression that your child has some catching up to do in one or more of these subjects, send them over for this remedial lesson. The distance learning phase should be over on December 4th and we all hope that face-to-face teaching will be possible again.
