



Dear students and parents,

These are the guidelines regarding the running of the school after the Easter break:

### Prevention strategy

- According to our prevention strategy, every individual is required to disinfect their hands when entering the building and to wear their face masks (Years 5-8) or FFP-2 masks (Years 9-12, teachers, non-teaching staff, external visitors).
- The one-way system on the stairs will be kept. The stairs next to the buffet lead upstairs, the stairs at the end of the corridor near the music rooms lead downstairs.

### The wearing of face masks

- All external visitors as well as non-vaccinated / non-recovered teachers or non-teaching staff must wear FFP-2 masks in the entire school building.

### COVID testing

- Students have to perform no less than one PCR test per week (***Wednesdays in Upper Austria***). Additional antigen testing can continue as of April 19, 2022, if required, i.e., if there are COVID cases in a class or the number of confirmed cases in school is high. ***To be on the safe side, there is an antigen test for all students on Tuesday, April 19, 2022.***

If students do not take part in PCR testing in school but attend class, they have to present a negative PCR test result not later than the following day.

- Non-vaccinated teachers / non-teaching staff or those teachers / non-teaching staff without a self-isolation certificate or proof of recovery who are inside the school building regularly have to present a negative external or internal PCR test result minimum once a week.
- The mandatory daily proof of a low epidemiological risk will no longer be required for teachers, non-teaching staff as well as students. This means that the COVID Ninja Pass will no longer be used after the Easter break.

### Tests (Schularbeiten)

- Students have to take a catch-up test if more than half of the tests (=Schularbeiten) of a semester were missed. This also applies to senior grades.
