

Behaviour agreement at Europagymnasium Auhof (Kepler, eLLA, LISA)

We would like to guarantee the aims of our mission statement to a high degree. Living and working together should reflect in a harmonious classroom – as well as school climate and should be as agreeable as possible. To achieve this, compliance with certain rules is necessary.

On the following pages you'll find a behaviour agreement (expected behaviour as well as consequences agreed upon) worked on by some teachers, students and parents' representatives. The house rules (=Schülervereinbarung) are not replaced but complemented by this agreement. In case a student violates this agreement, there first attempt to solve the problem should be a conversation between student and teacher.

Additionally, the following measures should be taken:

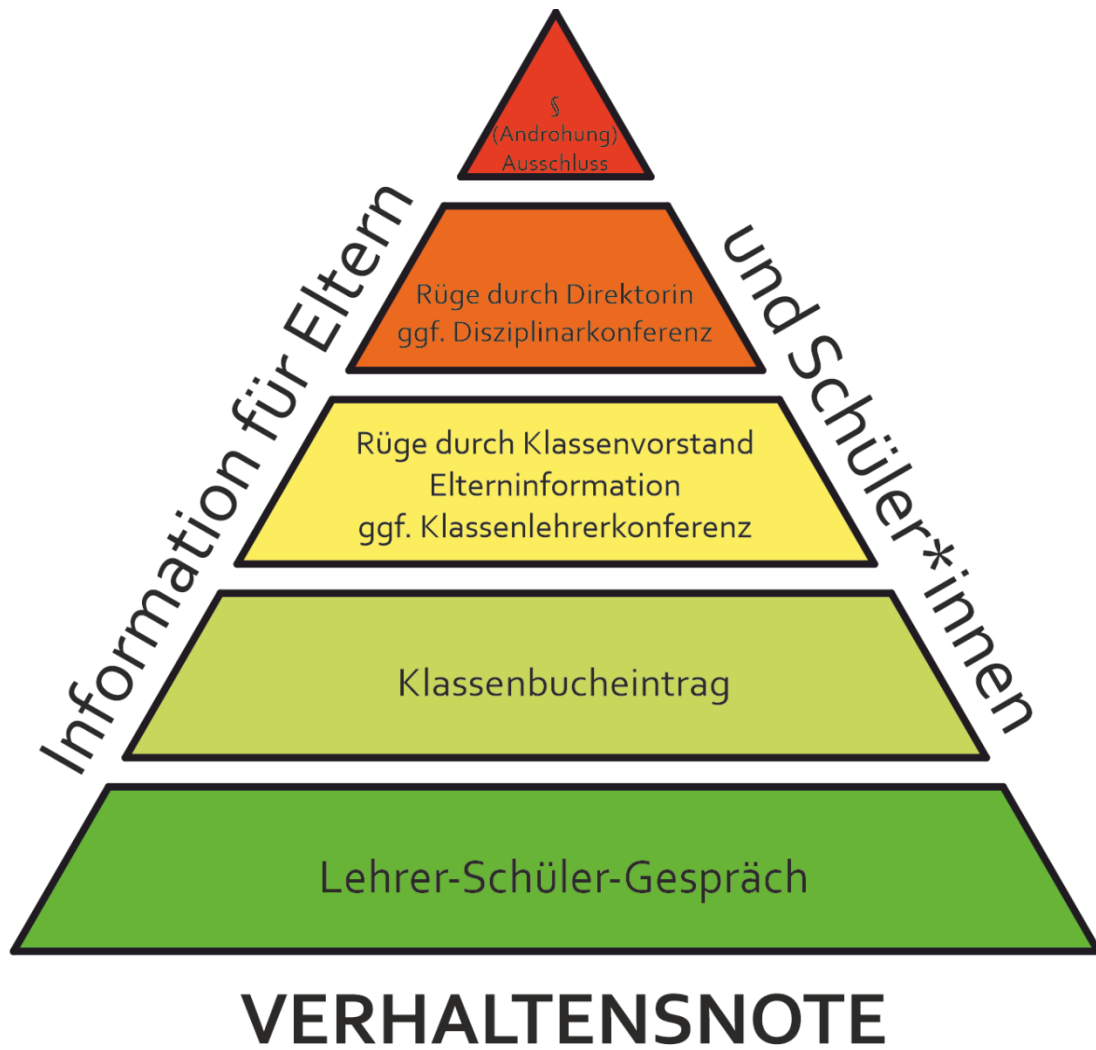
- Written reflection about the misconduct
- Catching up on missed learning content outside school hours
- Cleaning measures (outside school hours as well)
- Extension of class prefect duty
- Entry in the class registry
- Information of parents
- Compensation for damages

Additionally, individual classes can make in class agreements with their teachers.




Students showing problematic behaviour should be supported by the school psychologist or school doctor.

Rule violations do have an impact on the conduct grade. ^




In the case of the repeated violation of rules and grave misconduct (the physical and mental injury of others, theft, ...) consequences from rebuke by the homeroom teacher to the initiation of the expulsion procedure are used.

PROMOTION OF POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR OF TEACHERS TOWARDS STUDENTS

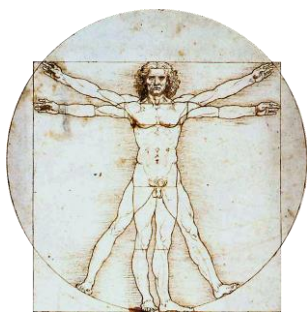
